




# Student Public Interest Group report 2016

- ▶ Nearly one third (29.7%) used financial aid to pay for their textbooks
- Students using loans to would pay an additional \$34.72 for a \$150 textbook



"OER are teaching, learning, and research resources that reside in the public domain or have been released under an intellectual property license that permits their free use and re-purposing by others. Open educational resources include full courses, course materials, modules, textbooks, streaming videos, tests, software, and any other tools, materials, or techniques used to support access to knowledge."

Various definitions have been given for Open Educational Resources (OER). One of the most widely accepted is:

Open Educational Resources (OER) are teaching, learning and research materials in any medium that reside in the public domain and have been released under an open license that permits access, use, repurposing, reuse and redistribution by others with no or limited restrictions (Atkins, Brown & Hammond, 2007).

On the Creative Commons Wiki there is a summary of some OER definitions and a table that shows common and different points in the different definitions.

#### Mini Grants

- ▶ 10 stipends were granted
  - ► Goal was to encourage faculty to use low-cost or free alternatives to expensive course materials
    - Open-access scholarly resources
    - Library-licensed and owned resources
    - Learning objects and text created by the faculty

#### East Carolina's Course-Adopted eTextbook (CAT) Program

- Begun by then-Assistant Director Patrick Carr spring semester 2015
- Receive list of required textbooks from the bookstore
- Identify ebook versions we can purchase with unlimited simultaneous users
- Contact professors and make purchases
- Bookstore carries print for those students who want it

#### East Carolina's Course-Adopted eTextbook (CAT) Program

- Continued each fall and spring semester
- Added already-available ebooks
- Put all available by title or by prefix on LibGuide: http://libguides.ecu.edu/coursetexts
- > Spring 2016: 171 ebooks for 56 depts./programs

### **CAT Impact**

- ► ROI: \$91,066.72 / \$9,659.75 = \$9.43
- > Faculty: 74 professors, 4 multiple semesters
- ▶ 85 Classes
- ▶ 1,931 Students (not unique)



#### Bookstore Partnership

- Working with bookstore managers
- OER covered in their association literature
- Recent programs:
  - OpenStax partnership with NASCORP
  - ▶ B&N program with XanEdu to create custom materials





#### Next Steps

- ECU piloting Alternative Textbook program
  - ▶ 15 professors selected
  - "Adapt, adopt, or create"
  - Stipend for summer switchover
  - Classes to be offered fall 2016



### A New CAT: Combined Alternative Textbook Program

- Joint grant application from both ECU and UNCG Libraries
- Combining the Alternative Textbook and the Course Adopted eTextbook projects
- ▶ To be done at both universities
- Share practices, expertise
