## List of Taxables for Beaufort County, NC, for 1779

introduced and transcribed by Plummer Alston Jones, Jr.\*

Beaufort County, named for Henry Somerset, Duke of Beaufort, one of the Lords Proprietors of Carolina, was formed in 1712 from Pamptecough Precinct (1705) of old Bath County (1696). The county seat was originally Bath, incorporated in 1705, but later, in 1785, it was moved to Washington.

The List of Taxables for Beaufort County for 1779 (hereafter cited as the 1779 Tax List), the third oldest extant record of its kind for Beaufort County next to the tax lists for 1755 and 1764, is the second to be transcribed and published for the use of genealogists and local historians. The oldest tax list for Beaufort County, the 1755 Tax List, was previously transcribed by William Perry Johnson in 1956.

Population research in Beaufort County has been hindered by the fact that it was one of nineteen counties for which there is no surviving census record for the North Carolina State Census taken between 1785 and 1787. The 1779 Tax List is therefore an excellent substitute for the State Census. When it is used in conjunction with the 1790 Federal Census for North Carolina, the researcher can accurately determine changes in population over the intervening eleven-year period.<sup>4</sup>

Beaufort County in 1779 included areas which were later annexed to Craven County in 1801 and Martin County in 1816, as well as the extreme southeastern portion which was taken in 1872, along with a portion of Craven County, to form Pamlico County.<sup>5</sup> Researchers in the records of all of these counties will thus be interested in the 1779 Tax List.

The original tax list (stack file number LP.30.1), housed in the Archives, Division of Archives and History, North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources, is part of the General Assembly Papers (formerly the Legislative Papers). It is in good condition and, on the whole, legible, although the ink has faded. Physically, the document consists of twenty laminated sheets of paper sewn together and covered with stiff paper to form a booklet. The Archives staff has numbered in pencil the resulting twenty leaves (1-20) in the lower left-hand corner of the front page of each leaf. As both sides of each leaf were used for recording the taxables and their assessments, the resulting forty pages of the transcription are numbered in brackets [1-40] for ease of reference.

The 1779 Tax List reveals that Beaufort County at that period was divided into five tax districts. The total number of entities taxed was 486 with the corresponding totals for each of the five tax districts being respectively 127, 121, 99, 95, and 44. Of these 486 taxable entities, 441 were individuals, 9 were executors of estates, 34 were guardians of trusts, and 2 represented plots of land, i.e., Garzia's Land (page [26]) and Hickory Point (page [28]).

Ostensibly a listing of the valuation of each taxpayer's property, the 1779 Tax List also includes listings of poll taxes for 63 individuals, apparently with little or no taxable property. Each poll was assessed at a rate of £400 for a single poll and £100 for a married poll. Some citizens were assessed penalties for "not giving in" their taxes or, in modern terminology, for tax evasion. The standard penalty in such cases was to increase the normal assessment fourfold. The tax income collected was, in turn, apportioned into the following three tax categories with corresponding tax rates: (1) Public Tax, assessed at 25 shillings per 100 pounds valuation; (2) County Tax, assessed at 1 shilling per 100 pounds; and (3) Poor Tax, assessed at 1 shilling and 6 pence per 100 pounds.

The alphabetical arrangement of the 1779 Tax List suggests that the original tallies, no longer available, were alphabetized perhaps by the tax listers themselves or, more likely, by county officials. The researcher is cautioned to check the alphabetical section for the first name as well as the surname; for example, Walter Jones (page [12]) is listed under the "W" section for Walter rather than the "J" section for Jones. Also, at the end of the listing for each district are names "omitted in the alphabetical digestion," these names being listed in normal order with surname last. The researcher will thus need to search at least three possible ways in each district for a particular individual.

Although there are two distinctly different, but equally legible handwriting styles evident in the 1779 Tax List, it does not necessarily follow that the original tallies were neat and easy to transcribe. For example, "Purns" (page [27]) was most likely the clerk's transcription of the illegibly written "Purser" in the original tally, "Hotton" (page [31]) was probably "Holton," and so forth. Homophones must also be considered; for example, "Pincome" (page [17]) was more likely "Pinkham."

Within the pages of this tax list are contained not only data on the economic situation of Beaufort County, but also clues and/or direct references to possible relationships between and among individuals with the same surname; for example, on page [25], Robert Campen is identified as the son of James. The references \*Head Librarian, Elon College; P. O. Box 524, Elon College, NC 27244

to trusts and estates document recent changes in population as well as offer further clues to possible family relationships. The 1779 Tax List for Beaufort County, which can be scrutinized and pondered many different ways and for as many reasons, is thus a veritable treasure trove for the historical and genealogical researcher.
