- 2,500 Gal. JP8


Food and Water Distribution Operations

Medical

- 25 Citizen welfare checks
- 15 Patients treated at aid stations
- 2 Medical transports (non-emergency)

AFTER ACTION REVIEW

Preparation Phase

SUSTAINS	IMPROVES
Pre-positioning FPs, activating JOC Level III prior to landfall	Pre-position MREs to Warehouses for WLFP pax
No-notice HURREX previous week	Simplify / Consolidate SAD reports
Updating FP Composition seasonally	Apply AAR to CONPLAN 500-60 revision

Alert / Mobilization Phase

SUSTAINS	IMPROVES
Orders well-written, concise, timely	MSCs not aware of FP changes
MSC Reporting clear, concise, timely	Coastal Resp. Evac Spt. Plan for armories
Timely notification and assembly	Mobilize Chap. Spt. Package initially

AFTER ACTION REVIEW

Execution Phase

SUSTAINS	IMPROVES
Daily Conf. calls enhanced synchronization	Clear ID of FPs in orders (MFFP-1, MFFP-4, etc)
Integration of MFFPs w/ local Fire Dept.	Blue / Green Air for air asset tracking / capability
FRAGOs clear & Concise, no ambiguity	Improve RWC2P COP sharing w/ Branch LNO

Recovery Phase

SUSTAINS	IMPROVES
Sufficient maintenance man days allotted	Ensure fuel tankers top off before demobilizing
