# Beaufort County, N.C., List of Taxables, 1764

Beaufort County, named for Henry Somerset, Duke of Beaufort, one of the Lords Proprietors of Carolina, was formed in 1712 from Pamptecough Precinct (1705) of old Bath County (1696). The county seat was originally Bath, incorporated in 1705, but later, in 1785, the county seat was moved to Washington.

The three oldest extant tax lists for Beaufort County, North Carolina, are those for 1755, 1764, and 1779. The 1755 list was published by William Perry Johnson in 1956 and the 1779 list by Plummer Alston Jones, Jr., in 1989. A different transcription of the 1764 list was published by the Eastern North Carolina Genealogical Society in 1986, but the version below is more literal.<sup>2</sup>

Beaufort County in 1764 included areas which were later annexed to Craven County in 1801 and Martin County in 1816, as well as the extreme southeastern portion which was taken in 1872, along with a portion of Craven County, to form Pamlico County.<sup>3</sup> Researchers in the records of all of these counties will thus be interested in the 1764 tax list.

The original tax list is housed in the Archives, Division of Archives and History, North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources. The list is in good condition, with one minor tear, and, on the whole, legible, although the ink has faded. Physically, the document consists of twelve encapsulated sheets of paper, each 12½" x 4½", sewn together and covered with stiff paper to form a booklet. As both sides of each leaf were used for recording information, the resulting twelve leaves of the transcription are numbered in brackets [1-12] below for ease of reference.

Technically, the 1764 tax list is a poll tax list, no valuation of each taxpayer's property being given. The list is not divided into tax districts as many lists of this period were, but rather is a single alphabetical listing of taxables. According to the regulations in force at that time, the 1764 tax list records all white males, of sixteen years and upwards, and all blacks, male and female, freemen and slaves, of twelve years and upwards.<sup>4</sup>

There are three hundred seventeen separate household entries. For each household, the following information is noted in three columns: (a) Number of taxable whites, (b) number of taxable blacks, and (c) total of white and black taxables.

As indicated by the testifying signature of Wyriott Ormond, which appears on the second leaf of the document, it is apparent that the whole list is in Ormond's handwriting. The second leaf of the document also included addenda added after the tax list was completed as well as Ormond's calculation that there were seven hundred fifty-two taxable citizens, including three hundred fifty-five whites and three hundred ninety-seven blacks, in Beaufort County in 1764. A recalculation of the totals shows that there were at least seven hundred eighty citizens, including three hundred seventy-nine taxable whites. Eliminating the data torn from columns (b) and (c) of Reading Blount's entry on the third leaf of the document, there were at least four hundred one taxable blacks as well.

Many father-son relationships, including the first names of the sons, are indicated in the 1764 tax list. The entry for Bettey Powers on the tenth leaf of the document indicates that she had a daughter living with her, and some widowed female heads of households are identified by name. Some men and their wives were listed, but not taxable, presumably because of advanced age. The first names and sometimes the surnames of free blacks are also given.

Of all the extant tax lists for Beaufort County, the 1764 tax list is the richest treasure trove of genealogical data for proving relationships and indicating social and economic status within this eighteenth-century population.
