

PURPOSE STATEMENT


Purpose of this study: Explore and discover themes found on a Facebook support group page for persons who have undergone laparoscopic adjustable gastric band surgery.



- The Laparoscopic Band procedure involves placing an inflatable band around the upper portion of the stomach
- Physically limits how much can be eaten
- Complications include severe acid reflux, the band moving out the proper position, and food sensitivity
- This Facebook group consists of members who joined because they have a laparoscopic band or are considering getting one

METHODS

- A qualitative descriptive design was used to analyze data gathered by doing keyword searches of posts
- Data collected for 3 months
- IRB approval and permission from group admin was obtained
- Colazzi method was used
