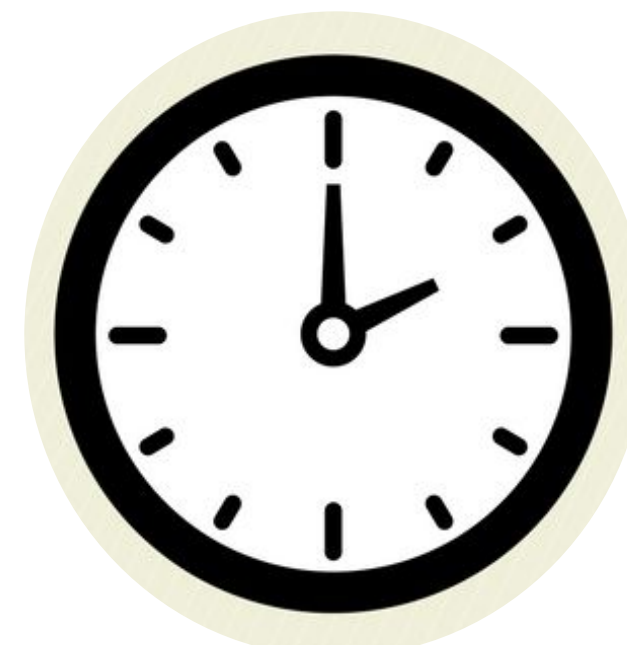




## Our Mission Statement

**Every 50 minutes, one death** occurs from a motor vehicle crash involving a drunk driver.

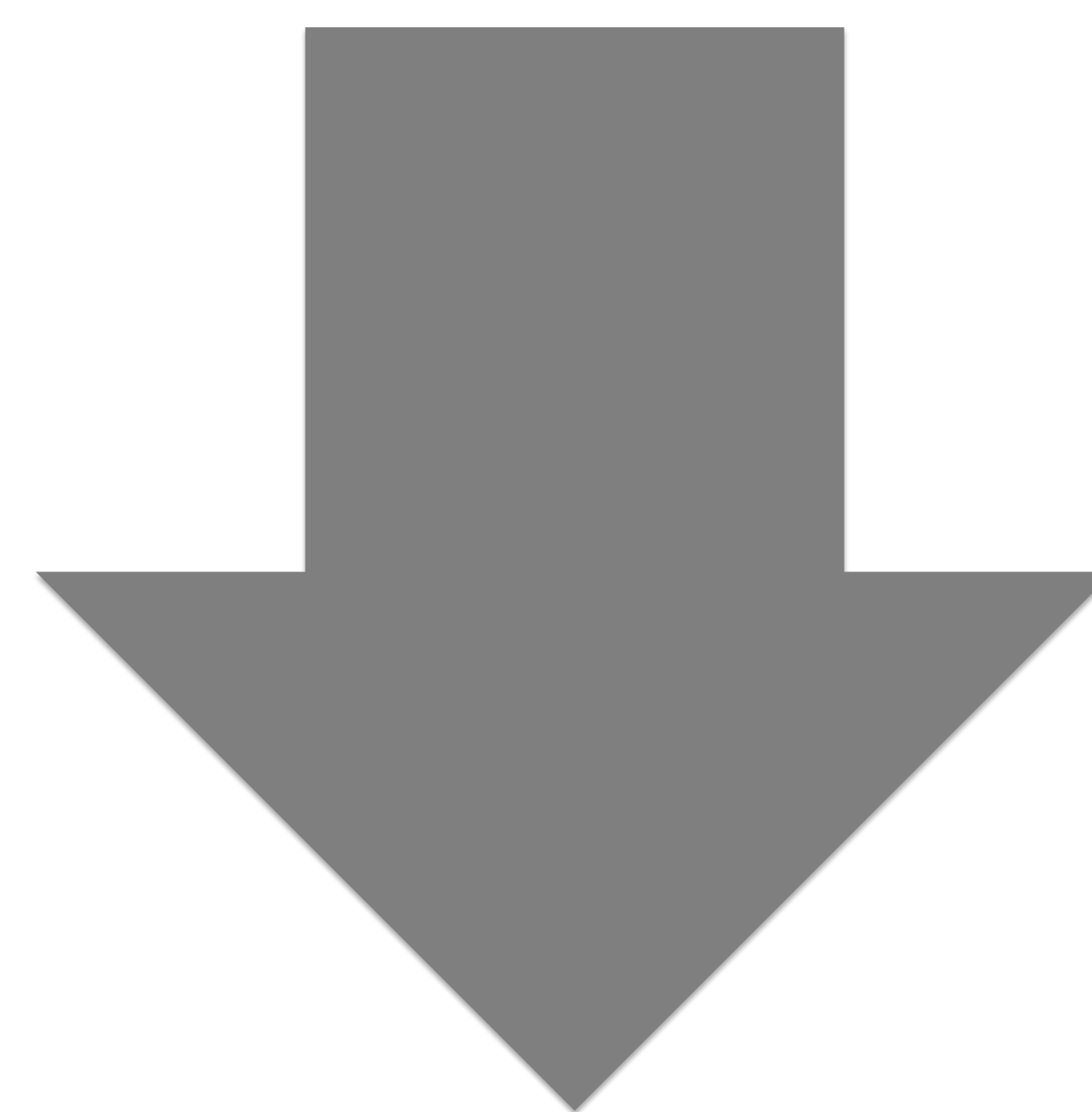
North Carolina has the third most DUI's in the country. **Pitt County is consistently ranked as one of the most dangerous counties in NC.**

“No way that could ever happen to me, that stuff only happens to other people, with other families, at other places”

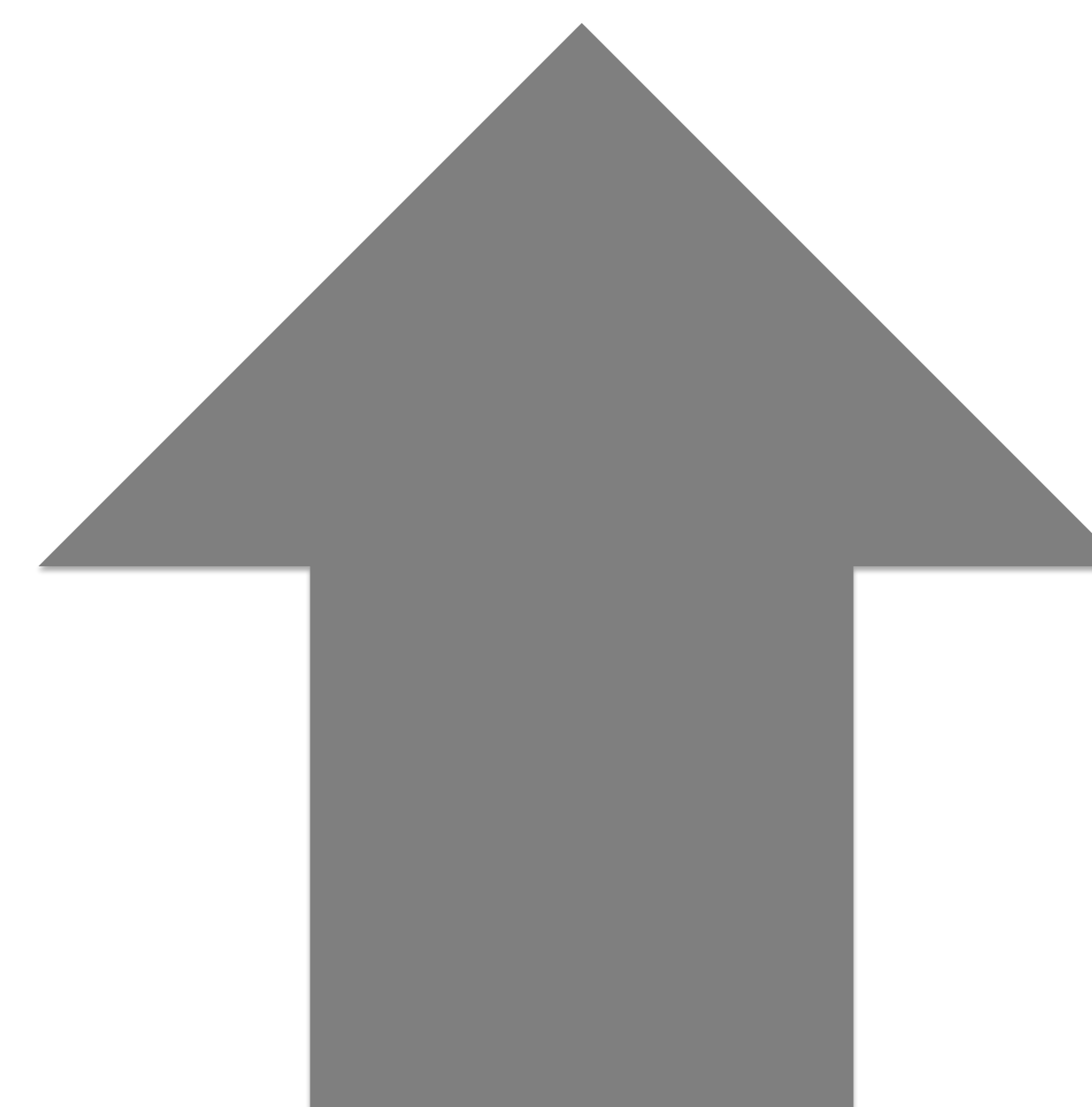


## The Problem
